STEWARDSHIP PARTNERSHIPS Weed Removal + Habitat Enhancement

The Sacramento Valley Chapter of the California Native Plant Society promotes protecting native plants and their habitats and increasing the use of native plants in gardens and public spaces in Sacramento, Sutter, Yuba, lower Placer, and northern San Joaquin Counties. We accomplish these goals through conservation, education, science, advocacy, horticulture, and land stewardship.

Stewardship Partnerships

The goal is to partner with local groups and regional parks to improve habitat in neighborhoods along the American River Parkway.

Stewardship Coordinator Team

1. work with Sacramento County Regional Parks' KC Sorgen for logistical support
2. find and work with active community groups interested in improving habitat along their piece of the American River Parkway
3. host stewardship events where they lead volunteers in removing invasive weeds and planting seeds and plant starts from the Sacramento County Regional Park's American River Parkway approved list.
4. It is a community building activity because the long-term success will be the community members caring for their area. This work is done by community volunteers; it is not restoration. It improves biodiversity by decreasing invasive plants and increasing native plant habitat.
5. Attend at least 3 of the 9 Board meetings each year (or write updates for the board), as needed. (Board meetings are Sept, Oct, Nov/Dec, January-June.)
